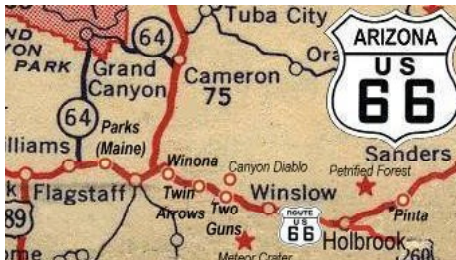
SCENIC

Route 66 is a scenic winding road that epitomizes the romance of the great southwest; the adventure in the journey. This is the romantic land of Spanish explorers, nomadic native herdsman, rowdy cowboys and brazen outlaws. The history of the land comes alive as you travel Route 66 in eastern Arizona.

Meteor Crater was formed about 20,000 years ago from a meteor impact. It is well worth the side trip to view this natural wonder. Route 66 travelers felt the same way as this site was listed in Jack Rittenhouse's Route 66 Guidebook published in 1946.

Winslow was founded as a railroad division terminal in the early 1880's. It became a favorite stopping place on Route 66 during its heyday. **The La Posada Hotel**, a Harvey House built in 1930, provided fine cuisine and elegant lodging for the road weary traveler and railroad passenger alike. Bits and pieces of Route 66 can still be found throughout the town.

ENTERTAINMENT



With the **Painted Desert**, **Petrified Forest** and Indian Reservations nearby, Holbrook became the tourist headquarters for Route 66 travelers. Every Route 66 guidebook of the day spoke of the things to do and see around this country. Remnants of the businesses that sprang up to service these travelers can still be found in Holbrook.

Meteor Crater - Start at the Visitor Center where we will view “Collisions and Impacts” —shown twice each hour—allows viewers to sample the wondrous sound and explosive fury of the meteor’s super-heated trip through the Earth’s atmosphere and ground-shaking

collision with the Earth in Northern Arizona. Visitors may then choose to view the crater via the air-conditioned indoor viewing area or venture out on the crater’s rim on one of several self-guiding observation trails. We’ll enjoy free time to explore before getting our Box Lunch.



The famous **Lorenzo Hubbell Trading Post** and the famous **street corner in Winslow** (given worldwide attention in Jackson Browne’s song “Take it easy” sung by the Eagles) will be photo stops on our tour.



We’ll enjoy a docent-guided tour of the **Old Trails Museum**, which explores the history and cultures of this high desert community and the surrounding area.

Petrified Forest is best known for globally significant Late Triassic fossils. The park attracts many researchers. Geologists study the multi-hued Chinle Formation. Archeologists research over 13,000 years of history. Biologists explore one of the best remnants of native Arizona grassland. We’ll stop at the **Painted Desert Visitor Center** with time to view “Timeless Impressions”, an orientation film about the park. We’ll then travel to the **Painted Desert Inn National Historic Landmark**, located at Kachina Point. It once served as a respite for travelers along historic Route 66. From the inn, you may view distant vistas of the Painted Desert. As we continue on to the southern end of the park, we’ll travel the **Blue Mesa Scenic Rd.** to the overlook where we will enjoy the beautiful scenery. We’ll end our trip through the park at the **Rainbow Forest Museum**, which provides exhibits of petrified wood, fossils, and displays of prehistoric animals. The Giant Logs are seen on a 0.4 mile loop located behind the museum. Giant Logs features some of the largest and most colorful logs in the park. “Old Faithful”, at the top of the trail, is almost ten feet wide at the base!



The La Posada in Winslow is a gem in the desert. Its charm lies in its simplicity of well-crafted line that captures the spirit of the Southwest. The La Posada Harvey House was the last one built. It was built in 1930 at the unbelievable cost of two million dollars. This was in the midst of the great depression and Santa Fe Railroad was expecting Winslow to become another mecca like Santa Fe, New Mexico. We will enjoy a tour with our

own costumed Harvey Girls following our signature lunch in the famous Turquoise Room.



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
